Funding Limitation/ Match Requirement	<p>A grant for a capital project under this subsection shall be for 80% of the net capital costs of the project.</p> <p>A recipient of a grant under this subsection may provide additional local matching amounts.</p>			
Prioritization Criteria	<p>The remainder of the net project cost shall be provided—</p> <p>(i) in cash from non-Government sources other than revenues from providing public transportation services;</p> <p>(ii) from revenues derived from the sale of advertising and concessions;</p> <p>(iii) from an undistributed cash surplus, a replacement or depreciation cash fund or reserve, or new capital;</p> <p>(iv) from amounts received under a service agreement with a State or local social service agency or private social service organization; or</p> <p>(v) from revenues generated from value capture financing mechanisms.</p>
